

ESCAMBIA COUNTY RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Escambia County's Drop Off Recycling Program

Many of the materials used everyday in your home can be recycled and reused. Recycling saves landfill space and reduces carbon buildup in the atmosphere.

Escambia County has 17 drop-off sites, with large green containers, where reusable materials may be taken. At these locations, recyclables must be placed in the appropriate section, with one bin for paper products and the other for metal and plastics.

What can you recycle?

- Aluminum cans (soda, beer, juice) and steel (tin) cans (soup, tuna). NO hangers or appliances.
- Glass containers without lids. NO mirrors, porcelain, cookware, ceramics, light bulbs.
- Plastic containers with numbers #1 #7 (e.g. milk, juice, laundry detergent, shampoo) NO unnumbered plastic containers (microwave trays, hangers, plastic bags)
- Cardboard (flattened and dry)
- Mixed paper (newspapers, magazines, junk mail, phone books, cereal boxes, toilet paper rolls, soda cartons) NO waxed or food contaminated containers (milk or juice cartons)

Rinsing is recommended for sanitary reasons and crushing to save space.

FYI: most grocery stores are now collecting and recycling plastic shopping bags.

Emerald Coast Utilities Authority (ECUA)

Escambia County ECUA customers may recycle yard trash.

Yard Trash Pick-up Information

- Yard trash is defined as leaves, pine straw, grass clippings and small pruning.
- Please do not use your ECUA garbage container for yard trash, as this material must be collected separately from household

- refuse in compliance with state environmental laws.
- For effective pick-up, yard trash must be containerized in plastic bags or standard garbage containers that do not exceed 32 gallons in size or weigh more than 40 lbs. when full.
- Cut limbs, not exceeding 4 feet in length or 40 lbs. in weight, must be bundled in a pile no larger than 4 feet x 4 feet in size and must be placed within 2 feet of the curb for collection.
- Each week, the ECUA will collect one pile of cuttings and up to 6 (six) bags or containers of yard trash, which must be placed at the curb prior to 5:30 a.m. on your scheduled yard trash collection day.

Escambia County is considering some form of curbside recycling, but until a final decision is made please continue to use the drop off recycling bins.

Santa Rosa County's Drop Off Recycling Program

What can you recycle?

- Glass (clear, green or brown bottles or jars) NO plate glass, auto glass or stained glass
- Metal (steel, tin, aluminum) NO aluminum foil. sheet metal
- Plastic Containers with numbers #1 & #2 only, with neck (soda, water, jugs, etc.) NO 5 gallon buckets/pails, motor oil containers, plastic bags, styrofoam, commercial water bottles (Culligan, Abita Springs, etc.).
- Mixed Paper (newspapers, magazines, catalogues, junk mail, phone books, cereal boxes, computer paper, soda cartons) NO waxed or food-contaminated containers (milk or juice cartons or pizza boxes)
- Cardboard (flattened and dry)
